



Mini-Grants for Educators of Students with Emotional/Behavioral Disorders

As part of its mission, Illinois Council for Children with Behavior Disorders (Illinois CCBBD) supports special educators and other professionals who are improving the educational experience of children and adolescents with emotional/behavioral disorders (E/BD). To that extent, Illinois CCBBD offers one-time funds (i.e., mini-grants) to educators with projects that directly benefit students with E/BD.

Mini-Grant Recipients will receive:

A maximum award of \$500.00 and

Free registration to the 2018 Illinois CCBBD Winter Conference held on February 2 and 3 in Lisle, Illinois.

Application Guidelines

Interested applicants must be a current member of Council for Exceptional Children (CEC), Council for Children with Behavioral Disorders (CCBD), and complete the online application addressing the following sections:

1. Provide a detailed narrative describing the project,
2. Provide an itemized proposed budget for the project, and
3. Indicate the project will be completed by June 30, 2018.

Application deadline is Wednesday, November 15 at 11:00 pm.

Please note:

- All funds must be used to provide services directly to students as detailed in the application. Upon conclusion of the project, a brief written summary must be provided to the Illinois CCBBD Executive Board by July 15, 2018.
- Awards are non-transferable.
- Awards will not be awarded to the same individual/group for any consecutive years.
- Award winners must agree to present the results of their project at the 2018 Winter Conference on February 3, 2018 or 2018 Summer Institute and also must agree to serve on the Mini-Grant Committee for the following year.

Application Process

- A. Applications must complete the online application available at ilccbd.org (Mini-Grant Application located in the menu bar) by Wednesday, November 15 at 11:00 pm.
- B. Proposals will be forwarded to the Mini-Grant committee for review.
- C. The review will be based only on the information provided in the application.
- D. Incomplete applications and proposals that do not clearly indicate a direct benefit to students with EBD will not be considered.
- E. The Mini-grant Committee will make recommendations for final approval of the Illinois CCBBD Executive Board.
- F. Mini-Grant recipients will be notified via email by the Illinois CCBBD President no later than December 15, 2017.
- G. Awards will be distributed at the Illinois CCBBD Winter Conference on Saturday, February 3, 2018 in Lisle, Illinois.
